- JF provided an update about the postponed ICAR202\_now\_2021. Highlights of the meeting include the diversity of the plenary speakers and the community-participation in design of concurrent sessions. JF reports that the NAASC organizing committee will welcome input from MASC on pursuing the virtual components for ICAR2021- Seattle if needed.

- GP reported that early discussions have taken place with South American members of MASC to ascertain whether they would be interested in hosting this meeting in one of their countries (Brazil, Argentina, Chile). Regional instability makes it challenging to make any firm decisions at the moment. In theory JF/GP would be able to help out with organization of this meeting but any decisions on meeting location will be made after ICAR2021.
  - 35<sup>th</sup> ICAR 2025 in Europe
  - GP reported that Moritz Novack and Tom Beeckman in Ghent, Belgium have previously expressed an interest in hosting this meeting.
  - 36<sup>th</sup> ICAR in Asia
- Singapore/ Taiwan/ Other... Attendees decided there is no rush making a decision on the location of this meeting.

NP encouraged attendees to consider what they would include within the 4<sup>th</sup> decadal roadmap. The previous three roadmap documents have been important milestones during the evolution of the global Arabidopsis research community. The MASC leadership team hopes that preparation of this document will involve members from outside of the historic hubs of Arabidopsis research in America, Western Europe and Japan. MASC plan to organize a workshop session to discuss the Roadmap at ICAR2021 in Seattle.
